ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership of the Delaware Association of DECA shall consist of the total eligible members of the chartered local chapters and members shall hold the same membership status as in their local chapters.

Section 2. Each local chapter and State Association shall be open for membership to all marketing education students regardless of race, sex, color, or national origin.

Section 3. Classes of membership which will be recognized by the Delaware Association of DECA are:

- **Student Membership**. Full-time students enrolled in marketing education course for the current school year.

- <u>Professional Membership</u>. Persons associated with or participating in the professional development of DECA as approved by the State Association. Such members shall include chapter advisors, teacher educators, and supervisors. Professional members will pay dues as established by DECA, but members will be ineligible to serve as a national voting delegate, hold national office, or otherwise represent the State Association of DECA.
- Associate Membership. Cooperative employers, and/or training station sponsors, and persons associated with the contributing to the improvement and development of the organization and marketing and distributive education. Associate members are not eligible to vote or hold office.
- Honorary Life Membership. Individuals who have made significant contributions to the development of DECA and marketing and distributive education, who have been nominated from among the marketing and distributive education field and are selected by the Executive Committee. Such membership shall not require payment of dues, nor will be granted the right to vote or hold office.

Section 4. A membership year will be from September 1, through August 31.

ARTICLE VIII - DUTIES OF STUDENT OFFICERS

3 Section 1.

<u>President</u>. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all business meetings; to preside over the Executive Committee meetings; to serve as an ex-officio member of Advisory Board; to make all necessary committee appointments including the designation of committee chairpersons; to develop with his/her Executive Committee a program of work for his/her term of office; and to make himself/herself available, as necessary, in promoting the general welfare of Delaware DECA. The President shall report at designated Advisory Board meetings concerning Executive Committee activities.

- <u>Vice President</u>. It shall be the duty of the Vice President to serve in any capacity as directed by the President; to serve as chairperson of the student committees; to accept the responsibilities of the President as occasions may demand; and to be available, as necessary to promote the general welfare of Delaware DECA.
- Section 3. Secretary. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to serve in any capacity as directed by the President; to record the proceedings of all business and Executive Committee meetings; to accumulate the minutes and/or proceedings of all committee meetings; and to be available, as necessary, to promote the general welfare of Delaware DECA.
- Section 4. **Treasurer**. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to serve in any capacity as directed by the President; to present any financial and membership reports necessary; and to be available, as necessary, in promoting the general welfare of Delaware DECA.
- Section 5. Reporter. It shall be the duty of the Reporter to furnish information to the chapters of Delaware through a newsletter. The reporter shall be responsible for all Delaware DECA publicity and be available, as necessary, in promoting the general welfare of Delaware DECA.
- Section 6. Parliamentarian. It shall be the duty of the Parliamentarian to be responsible for the general conduct at the State Career Development Conference by formulating and distributing rules of conduct approved by the Executive Committee. He/she shall review constitutions of new chapters. The Parliamentarian shall rule on rules of orders, should the occasion arise during the business meetings of Delaware DECA; and shall be available, as necessary, in promoting the general welfare of Delaware DECA.
